Activity Report till February 2026 - Academic Year 2025–2026

- Promoting the Sector’s electronic portal through the faculty’s official email system and during introductory lectures for various courses.
- **Breast Cancer Awareness Month (October 2025) - Baheya Foundation**
 - Within the framework of the Memorandum of Understanding signed with the Baheya Foundation, the Community Service and Environmental Affairs Sector at the Faculty of Medicine, in collaboration with NGUMA and Ibrahim Badran Family (IBF), organized two awareness sessions on 20 and 29 October 2025 in celebration of Breast Cancer Awareness Month.
 - The first session, entitled “*Breast Cancer Awareness: Breast Self-Examination and Early Detection,*” was conducted as a workshop directed toward students. It was attended by 93 students, and participants received certificates of attendance.
 - The second awareness session was held on 29 October 2025, with a focus on engaging facilities management staff and administrative employees. It was attended by 30 members of the Housekeeping and security admin teams.
 - The sessions addressed risk factors, the importance of screening and early detection, available treatment options, and the practical support provided to survivors.

- **Breastfeeding Awareness Campaign**


- The campaign was conducted on 25 October and 8 November 2025 at New Giza University Community Hospital as part of its community service activities.
- The Community Service and Environmental Affairs Sector at the Faculty of Medicine, in collaboration with Dr. Shaimaa Adel from the Department of Pediatrics and the Egyptian Foundation for Child Health and Nutrition, organized an awareness campaign highlighting the importance of breastfeeding.
- Awareness sessions were held on 26 October 2025 and 8 November 2025 at New Giza University Community Hospital. The sessions addressed the benefits of breastfeeding and provided guidance regarding the use of infant formula.
- A total of 48 medical students from New Giza University participated in educating mothers and responding to their inquiries. Certificates of participation will be issued to the students who attended and contributed to the campaign.



- **Blood Donation Campaign**

- Organized in cooperation with the National Blood Transfusion Services, Ibrahim Badran Foundation (IBF), and NGUMA Student Family.
- **Date:** 2–3 November 2025.
- The Community Service and Environmental Affairs Sector allocated appropriate facilities for the campaign in Building 2A for blood donation activities. The campaign was conducted with the participation of Dr. Amr El-Hasany and Dr. Hedeya Ameen to ensure compliance with first aid safety and security standards. The campaign successfully attracted 207 donors, resulting in 197 usable blood units.
- A letter of appreciation addressed to the Faculty by the National Blood Transfusion Services was presented.
- **Campaign Slogan:** “Join the Movement... Save a Life.”



• Awareness Session: Body Building vs. Kidney Damage – December 2025

An awareness session titled “Body Building vs. Kidney Damage” was successfully conducted by **Dr. Mohammed Abdel Gawad-Internal Medicine and Nephrology** on 29th December. The event was organized by NGUMA in collaboration with the Internal Medicine Department and the SOM Community Service and Environmental Affairs Sector (CSEA).

The session provided an informative and evidence-based discussion on gym supplements, highlighting what is safe versus potentially harmful, addressing common myths in bodybuilding, and examining the possible effects of certain supplements and practices on kidney health. The objective was to promote informed decision-making and encourage healthy fitness practices while safeguarding overall well-being.



A number of students and staff members attended the session, contributing to meaningful engagement and discussion. The event effectively emphasized the importance of building strong bodies while protecting kidney health.

Evacuation Drill Report
Date: Tuesday, 4 November 2025

First: Drill Details

- **Buildings Covered by the Drill:** Building (A) and Building (2A) – New Giza University
- **Date of Implementation:** Tuesday, 4 November 2025

Objectives:

- To assess the College's readiness to respond to emergencies and crises by testing the effectiveness of the established procedures and evaluating participants' responsiveness during evacuation.
- To raise awareness among students and all College staff regarding the approved evacuation plan, ensuring their full understanding of evacuation routes, assembly points, and required instructions.
- To reduce evacuation time and achieve the best possible evacuation duration.

Duration:

- **Building (2A):** The drill commenced at 10:15 a.m. and lasted ten minutes until arrival at the assembly point.
- **Building (A):** The drill commenced at 11:45 a.m. and lasted twenty minutes until arrival at the assembly point.



Second: Evacuation Details by Building

1. Building (2A)

- **Areas Evacuated:**
The Simulation Laboratory, Room G.18 (Ground Floor), Room 1.47 (First Floor), and faculty offices on the Second Floor.
- **Numbers:**
14 faculty members, 3 administrative staff members, and 160 students from the Faculties of Medicine and Arts & Design.
- **Time to Reach the Assembly Point:**
10 minutes.
- **Remarks:**
The drill was successfully completed in accordance with the established plan.



2. Building (A)

- **Areas Evacuated:**
Lecture Halls 1 and 2, the courtyard opposite Beano's Café, and the Ground Floor waiting area.
- **Numbers:**
17 faculty members, 4 administrative staff members, and 120 students from the Faculty of Medicine.
- **Time to Reach the Assembly Point:**
20 minutes.
- **Remarks:**
The drill was successfully completed in accordance with the established plan.



Third: Implementation Procedures

- The drill was announced in advance via the Moodle platform.
- A documentary video was recorded and sent to the Quality Assurance Unit and the Community Service and Environmental Development Sector.
- Additional doors were opened to facilitate evacuation movement.
- It was ensured that elevators were not used during the drill.
- Participants were directed to exit by a designated supervising team member.
- The on-duty physician was present during implementation as a precautionary measure.
- Coordination was carried out with the Safety and Security Team to monitor exit points and ensure fire safety procedures were observed.

Fourth: Recommendations

1. Develop a plan to progressively improve evacuation time, including performance analysis for each drill, identification of delay points, and intensified awareness efforts to achieve the optimal target time.
2. Conduct comprehensive training for all staff and administrative personnel on fire safety and evacuation procedures during the second academic semester.

3. Assign one Teaching Assistant (TA) from each academic department to serve as the evacuation and emergency procedures coordinator within the building.
4. Upload clear visual maps of evacuation routes for all areas of Building (A) and Building (2A) to the student platform, and display them prominently within the buildings (such as corridors, entrances, lecture halls, and near elevators) to ensure clarity of routes for all College members and visitors.
