- They experienced ICU rounds, cardiology rounds, and cases files monitoring.

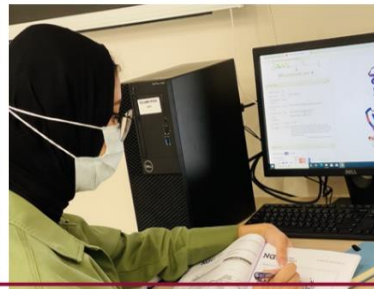
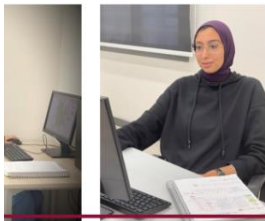
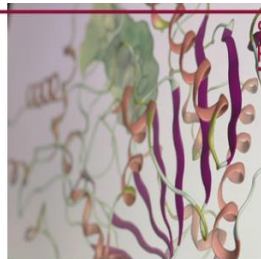
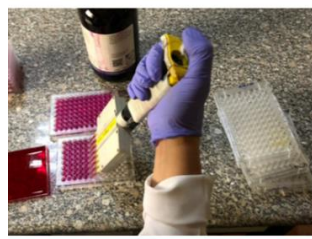


Student activities S1 AY2021/2022
