

Abitur Certificate

1- MOHE Conditions and certificate requirements:

- The Student must achieve 12 years of schooling.
- The Student must submit the Certificate, the grades and the Key table (six papers).
- Seven Subjects can be taken from Grade 10, 11 and 12 (the required subjects for the **Medical Schools and Information Technology School (Science/ Math section)** are Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and English and for the **Social studies** are English & Mathematics)
 - ❖ The requirements are as follows: one Subject "only" can be taken from Grade 10 and the remaining subjects are from Grade 11 and 12.
- Each Subject has a point and this point is converted to a percentage from the Key table.
- The Highest 3 qualifying subjects (above 85%) in the Abitur certificate are considered as advanced Subjects and 15 points are added to each subject's percentage. Another 15 points can be added on the 4th subject (the German subject only) if it is above 75%

2- Required stamps:

Certificate:

Inside Egypt

- The German Embassy in Egypt
- The Egyptian Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Egypt
- General Department of Examinations in Egypt in case the School is inside Egypt).

Outside Egypt

Proof of 12 years of schooling:

- If the school is inside Egypt, then the required stamps are: School stamp and the Ministry of High Education الإدارة التعليمية التابعة للمدرسة
- If the school is outside Egypt then the required stamps are: School stamp, Ministry of High Education in the country of the school, the country embassy and the Ministry of Foreign affairs in Egypt.

Arabic & Religion exams paper:

- If the school is inside Egypt, then the required stamps are: General Examinations Department in Egypt.
- If the school is outside Egypt then the required stamps are: School stamp, Ministry of High Education in the country of the school, the Egyptian embassy in the country of the school and the ministry of foreign affairs in the country of the school.
